Scripture Focus: Matthew 5 – 7 – The Sermon on the Mount

Memory Scripture:

"So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets." Matthew 7:12

The Beatitudes – Matthew 5:3-12 (Flash Cards for each rotation provided)

Objectives:

1. The children will demonstrate and be able to articulate what it means to "love each other" from Mathew 7:12.
2. The children will demonstrate an understanding of and be able to recite the Beatitudes from Matthew 5:3-12.
3. The Children will be able to identify the location of the Lord's Prayer in the Bible and be able to recite it independently.

Each Rotation Workshop will Emphasize:

- The Lord's Prayer - begin and end each session by praying this prayer
- The Beatitudes - reinforce the memorization by reviewing with the provided flash cards
- Memory Verse - recite and practice during each session
- The Sermon on the Mount – review the setting and purpose of this teaching by Jesus
- The Sermon on the Mount is found in Matthew. All workshops incorporate Bible use.
- Moses went up the mountain to bring a new law to the people. Jesus is on the mount giving new meaning to the law of Moses.
- The grammar/vocabulary/concepts of the beatitudes is difficult for small children. Focus on teaching the basic concept and putting into real life situations.
- The Beatitudes turned and still turn the values of the world upside down. This kind of teaching (God's teaching) got Jesus in trouble with the Pharisees. It could get us in trouble with other too.
